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Welcome

Welcome to the Canberra Region Beekeepers. The purpose of the Association is to foster and promote responsible beekeeping across the ACT and surrounding regions. The Association achieves this through several forums including regular meetings, events and an online presence.

The following information is designed to assist new (and existing) members of the Association so they get the best from their membership, while providing different opportunities for members to be engaged with the Association.

The Association welcomes backyard, hobby and commercial beekeepers.

Apiary

The Association maintains an apiary at the [Jerrabomberra Wetlands in Fyshwick](#). The Apiary consists of a variety of hive types and is managed by the Apiary Manager and a team of dedicated volunteers. Frequent events are held at the apiary and members are encouraged to attend and get involved in maintaining the hives all the while increasing or sharing their beekeeping knowledge.

Classes

The Association organises a variety of classes throughout the year. These include introductory and beginners' classes through to extension classes where the focus is on a particular element of beekeeping i.e. honey extraction or requeening. Classes are listed on the Association's [website](#).

Code of Conduct

By its very nature, the Association draws its members from a wide background of professions, genders and ages. Members hail from most (if not all) Canberra suburbs, and regional areas in the ACT and surrounding NSW. The experience levels and interests of members varies across the different hive types and beekeeping philosophies. Members join our Association to gain knowledge, establish acquaintances and friendships with like-minded individuals and/or to share their beekeeping skills and knowledge. All members are asked to consider this in their interactions with other members, particularly those less experienced.

Members are asked to respect different beekeeping philosophies and/or views on beekeeping and treat other members with the respect. Remember – ask three beekeepers a question and you are likely to get five or more responses!






Code of Practice

The ACT Government has issued a [Code of Practice for Beekeeping in Residential Areas of the ACT - 2016](#). The Code covers a range of requirements for the keeping of bees in residential areas including: bee diseases and parasites, disease control and the number of hives permitted to be held in residential areas. Members who keep hives in the ACT are strongly encouraged to familiarise themselves with the ACT Code of Practice, which is available under the [Policies](#) tab on the Association's website.

The NSW Government has also issued a [Beekeeping Code of Practice for NSW](#) which applies to beekeepers whose hives are in NSW. Like the ACT Code, the NSW Code provides advice on the number of hives that can be kept and the siting of hives. Members with hives in NSW are strongly encouraged to familiarise themselves with the NSW Code. A copy of the NSW Code is also listed on the Association's website under the [Policies](#) tab.

Committee

The Association is governed by a management committee. The committee is comprised of:

Insurance





Members can access insurance for their beekeeping activities through arrangements put in place by the Association with AON Insurance. The AON insurance policy covers a range of events for backyard beekeepers, and members should consider the coverage available to assess whether it is suitable for their needs. Please note, insurance is not linked to your membership and expires on the anniversary from when your cover commenced.

Member Forum

Do you like to lead, follow or contribute to discussions relating to beekeeping? - then consider the [Member Forum](#) on the Association's website. The moderated Forum hosts a variety of discussions relating to beekeeping. All members are expected to contribute in a mature manner following standard courtesies for online forums.

Meetings

The Association meets on a monthly basis on the third Thursday of the month (except for March, October and December). Meetings are held in the hall at the [Yarralumla Primary School, Loftus Street, Yarralumla](#), commencing at 7.30pm. The December meeting is held on the second Thursday. The monthly meeting in March and October are usually held at the [Jerrabomberra Wetlands, Dairy Road, Fyshwick](#).

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Association is held in April each year commencing at 7.30pm. All management committee positions are vacated at the AGM and a new committee is elected. The management committee is essential for the good governance of the Association and is a requirement under ACT Legislation. Members are encouraged to consider nominating for a position on the management committee. Membership Fees

An annual membership of \$40.00 (Jan 19) is levied on members to assist in the running of the Association. There are two types of memberships; Standard and Family – Family membership includes members of your direct family and no additional fee is charged. Membership fees are due on the anniversary of joining. Your membership must be current to continue to access the benefits and services of the Association.
